


Start with a matchbox




Decorate the insides with fun papers!




On a piece of tag board, trace around the match box.

Leave 1 inch around the shape.

Draw a shape around the matchbox.



Cut out your shape



In the center of your tag board shape, trace around the matchbox with pencil. This will be where your window will be cut




Cut your window. Take care to cut right inside the line (you don't want the window to be too big for the matchbox!)




See if the matchbox fits the window (and doesn't fall through!)




Decorate the tag board shape with glue designs. Keep it simple!



Let it dry at least 24 hours.



Spread gluestick glue all over the glued design area of the tag board. Get in all the crevices to ensure good sticking!



Glue it down to aluminum foil, shiny side opposite the glue side.



Poke a hole in the center of the foil where the window is.

Cut 4 slits towards the corners of the window and fold around.

Trim the sides of the foil around the tag board, leaving a half inch to fold over.

Add gluestick to the back of the tag board.



Use a cotton swab to press down the foil and make the glue relief design stand out.



Use a wooden stylus to add embellishments. Use a flat stylus to smooth out areas if you choose.
